A life threatening emergency exists when it has been confirmed in writing by a veterinarian that your pet will die or have to be humanely euthanized if care is not provided within five days from the date of diagnosis. Must apply for Care Credit first, if Vet accepts it.



RedRover Relief. <http://www.redrover.org/>. The RedRover Relief program provides funding to Good Samaritans, animal rescuers and pet owners to help them care for animals in life-threatening situations. The goal of the program is to help animals who need immediate veterinary care to survive. Due to the overwhelming number of applications we receive, we cannot help everyone. The typical grant is \$100 to \$200, however larger grants may be awarded based upon several factors, including: medical urgency, financial need, available funding and eligibility.
